The Hub is part of The Mayor's Academies Programme. The Council has also established a pilot partnership between housing retrofit contractors and LSBU, including site visits and one two-week work experience. LSBU are also designing a course module and student project on housing retrofits. The Net Zero Innovation Challenge is run on behalf of Lambeth by Sustainable Ventures. It matches large businesses with innovative net zero start-ups, focusing on innovative solutions. The Council, working with partners, also delivers school engagement activities and work experiences, including a Virtual Work Experience through the platform Springpod, green skills sessions in schools with the Construction Youth Trust, and a Schools Engagement Programme delivered in partnership with Retrofit Action for Tomorrow (RAFT).
