## EXPERIMENTAL TRAFFIC RESTRICTIONS, AMENDMENTS TO A PARKING PLACE AND INTRODUCTION OF 30 MINUTE LIMITED WAITING FREE PARKING ON LYHAM ROAD

(NOTE: This Notice is about amendments to a parking place to provide free limited waiting space in support of local businesses. These measures will all be introduced as an experiment in the first instance so their effect can be assessed before a decision is made about whether to continue them permanently. Objections to this being continued on a permanent basis may be made, as well as any other comments – see paragraph 3.)

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth on 10 November 2023 made the above-mentioned Orders under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The general effect of the Orders, which will come into force on 20 November 2023, will be to remove experimentally in Lyham Road, the east side, from a point 7 metres north of the northern kerb-line of Prague Place northward for 10 metres, suspend part of the permit holder (DR & DB) and paid 4-hour limited waiting parking place and replace with free 30-minute limited waiting parking place operating Monday to Friday between 8.30am and 6.30pm.
- 2. A copy of each of the Orders and other documents giving detailed particulars about them (including maps) is available for inspection at the offices of Lambeth Council's Highways Team (Resident Services), 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, Civic Centre, 6 Brixton Hill, London SW2 1EG, until the Orders cease to have effect, or on-line at: www.lambeth.gov.uk/traffic-management-orders. - 3. The Council will consider in due course whether the provisions of the experimental Orders should be continued in force indefinitely by means of permanent Orders made under section 6, 45 and 46 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. Any person may object to the making of the permanent Orders, within a period of six months beginning with the date on which the experimental Orders come into force, or if any of the experimental Orders are varied by another Order or modified pursuant to section 10(2) of the 1984 Act, beginning with the date on which the variation or modification or the latest variation or modification comes into force. Any such objection or any representation must be made in writing and must state the grounds on which any objection is made and be sent to Roddy Williams, Highways Team (Resident Services), London Borough of Lambeth, PO Box 734, Winchester, SO23 5DG (emails sent to <a href="mailto:rwilliams@lambeth.gov.uk">rwilliams@lambeth.gov.uk</a> are also acceptable). Any objection or representation received may be communicated to, or be seen by, other persons who may have an interest in this matter.
- 4. If any person wishes to question the validity of the Orders or of any of their provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders are made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
