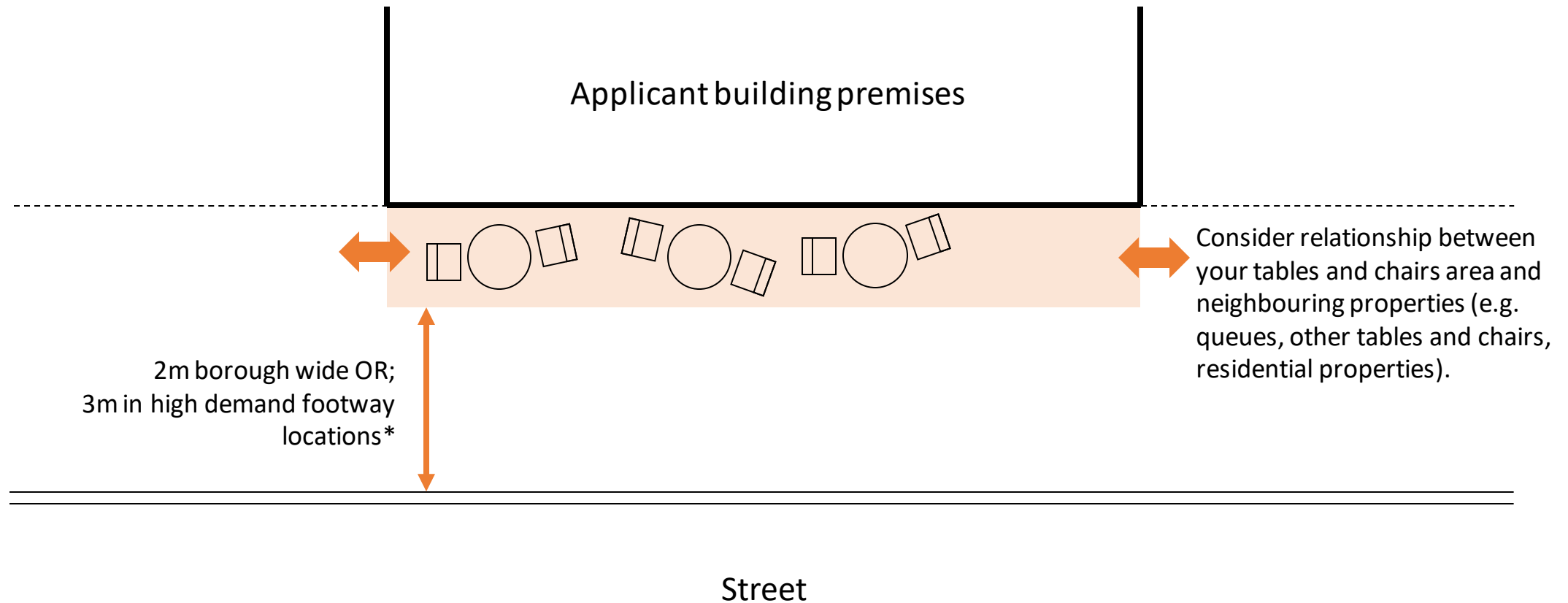
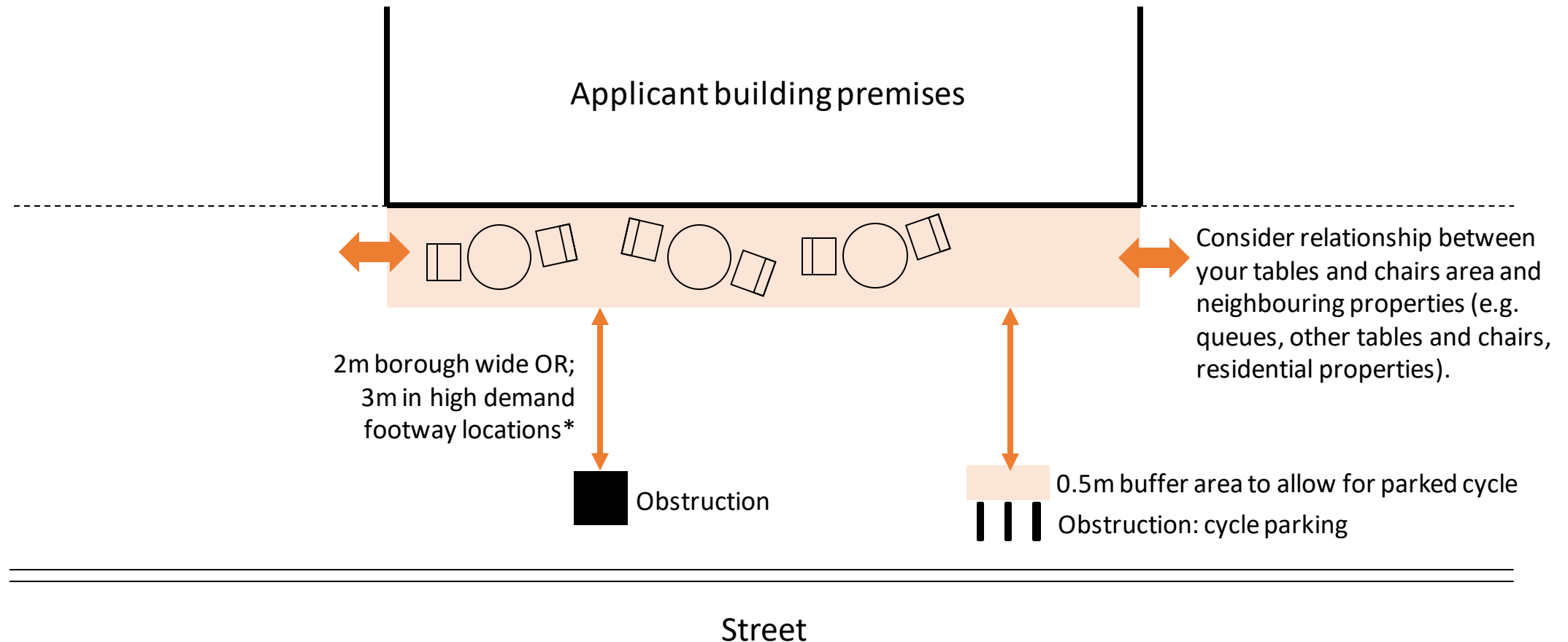


Physical considerations for your Pavement Licence application where there are no footway obstructions in the area outside your business premises.



Physical considerations for your Pavement Licence application where there are footway obstructions in the area outside your business premises.

Obstructions include, but not be limited to: phone box, bollard, lamp column, advertising hoarding including A-board, cycle parking stand (where a 0.5m buffer between the cycle stand is added to allow for parked cycles)



Other considerations for your Pavement Licence application.

Check that your use of an outside area is covered by appropriate insurance, including public liability insurance.

Consider your neighbouring residential properties. Proposals to amend business operations or expand outdoors should not adversely impact neighbouring residential amenity, particularly in terms of noise and nuisance.

The type of furniture permitted under the license includes counters or stalls for selling or serving food or drink, tables, chairs, benches, umbrellas, barriers and heaters for instance. The furniture must be removable and stored away in the evenings.

Physical considerations for repurposing of parking bays for furniture's.

This option can be considered in the instance where your business cannot achieve the minimum footpath width requirements when placing tables and chairs on the footpath outside its premises.
